### 'Coming to Christmas', (Revelation 22:17, NKJV)

***“And the Spirit and the bride say, “Come!” And let him who hears say, “Come!” And let him who thirsts come. Whoever desires, let him take the water of life freely.”*** (Revelation 22:17)

I hope that we are all ready for Christmas to come, and even more so that we all come to Christmas. Please consider today why you are coming to Christmas. Is it to celebrate a jolly old elf and snowmen, or to enjoy spirits and material possessions?
